Tuesday, July 17

After the Surge: A Progress Report on Iraq and Afghanistan

Andrew Garfield, Senior Fellow, FPRI

Andrew Garfield was the principal investigator of a 2005-06 FPRI study funded by Smith Richardson Foundation, "Succeeding in Phase IV," that examined U.S. performance in Iraq. He was European Director of the Terrorism Research Center, Deputy Director of International Policy Institute (IPI) at King's College London, and Senior Director of Influence and Insight for the Lincoln Group. Mr. Garfield is also a former senior British military then civilian intelligence officer and former senior policy advisor at the UK Ministry of Defense. Now back from several trips to Iraq and Afghanistan, he will report on his latest findings.

Kurlantzick's new book, *Charm Offensive* (Yale University Press), focuses on China's effort to influence politics and business in Asia, Latin America, Africa and the Middle East.
